- (8) How to protect yourself from vicarious trauma

320. Analytical Psychology in practice

An online seminar series of five interactive sessions addressing selected topics arising in therapeutic practice. Each session will have a theoretical base with applied clinical examples followed by questions and discussions around the clinical topic.

Subjects to be drawn from: dreamwork, shadow aspects, challenges of leadership clients, contrasting dynamics of young adults and elderly clients, working with anger and conflict.
