

Further Education in Analytical Psychology

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1. General Information¹

In 1948 the C.G. Jung Institute was formed as a foundation whose goal it is to maintain and develop the concepts and methods of Analytical Psychology and to promote exchange with an interested audience.

Analytical Psychology draws on the depth psychological concept of the unconscious psyche to expand the knowledge of phenomena and development within the soul; it strives to promote the comprehension of every human being's worth and uniqueness. Jung's central concept of individuation is not meant for just a few especially apt individuals. Instead, it aims to realize individual possibilities within everyone's social system, family group and society.

Apart from training Analytical Psychotherapists² and Jungian analysts, the C.G. Jung Institute also offers a variety of Further Education Programs. The Further Education Program in Analytical Psychology aims at accommodating the wishes of many people who want to familiarize themselves with Jungian Psychology and who desire to continue their education during one or two intensive semesters at the C.G. Jung Institute in Zurich. It is directed at interested people from various backgrounds who see Analytical Psychology as a way of inspiring and facilitating exchange with people, of understanding the world and society and as a way to approach the soul. Theoretical and practical courses are designed to acquaint the students with fundamental knowledge of Analytical Psychology and its manner of functioning. While working intensively with dreams, with the symbolic and historical material in the seminars and by writing a seminar paper, participants practice the symbolic approach from the perspective of Jungian Psychology. The Further Education Program Certificate can be attained after a minimum of two semesters and after having successfully completed a written paper and an oral exam.

We recommend regular Jungian analysis with an accredited analyst alongside the Further Education Program. Based on the confrontation with one's own possibilities and limits of development within personal analysis, the participants discover the effect of Analytical Psychology on themselves, so that a personal reference to the material is ensured.

As a Further Education Program participant, one has the status of a regular student at the Institute and is permitted to attend all public lectures as well as many seminars.

The courses are held by instructors, Training Analysts and Supervisors of the C.G. Jung Institute Zurich, Kusnacht as well as by guest lecturers.

2. Admission Criteria

People from all educational backgrounds are considered for admission to the Further Education Program.

3. Application and Admission Procedure

a. Application

Applicants are asked to send the following documents to the administration of studies:

- Application form
- Short description of their personal and professional motives for continuing their education at the Institute (1 to 2 pages)
- Two recent photographs of the applicant
- Payment receipt for the application fee of CHF 320.00 (no refund of the application fee)

All personal information will be treated confidentially.

As soon as all of your application documents have been received and reviewed by the director of studies, you will be informed – in writing – of your admission status.

Upon admission to the study program you will receive the Institute's Code as well as the House Rules of the C.G. Jung Institute. As a Further Education Program participant, you are obliged to comply with these regulations; the respective form has to be signed and sent back to the administration of studies.

b. Registration

For administrative reasons, it is essential that students who wish to maintain their matriculation at the Institute re-enroll each semester.

The fully filled-out enrollment form must be handed in to the administration before the enrollment deadline. The semester fees must be paid before the beginning of the semester. The enrollment form, as well as the enrollment deadline, is published in each semester's "Lectures and Seminars" brochure.

An interruption as well as a resumption of studies is possible at any time. Please inform the Director of Studies in writing.

4. Further Education Program

The following requirements must be fulfilled in order to acquire the certificate:

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| Duration of studies | a. Registration as a Further Education student at the C.G. Jung Institute Zurich for a minimum of two semesters. Regular attendance is required; 120 Credit points (45 min theory session) are considered a minimum. The lecturers must sign a booklet "Record of Course Attendance" for this purpose. |
| Seminar paper | b. Writing of a 10 to 20 page seminar paper on symbolic material, drawing on the various perspectives of Analytical Psychology (fairytales, dreams, religious or culture anthropological phenomena and so forth). The essay must be accepted by one of the Institute's Main-Examiner, Training analyst, Supervisor Candidate or Supervisor. Together with his seminar paper the student is to give the tutor an evaluation form (that can be obtained in the Administration of Studies) with the request that this, once it is filled out, be sent back to the administration. |
| Examination | c. Passing of the oral exam "Fundamentals of Analytical Psychology" – Registration for the exam is accomplished by handing in the appropriate form to the administration of studies, accompanied by the registration fee. Both a Main-Examiner and a Co-Examiner of the Institute will give the exam. The Further Education participant may choose the Main-Examiner himself (a list of Main-Examiners is available in the front office). |
| Personal analysis | |
| In general | <p>The recommended personal analysis will be confirmed by the Institute (a list of instructors accredited by the Institute is available on www.junginstitut.ch or at the front office).</p> <p>Present or past personal analysts may not be designated to supervise papers or hold examinations.</p> |

5. Further Education Program Certificate

After completing all of the requirements you will receive the “Confirmation of Theoretical Knowledge in Analytical Psychology”.

Receipt of the “Confirmation of Theoretical Knowledge in Analytical Psychology” does not constitute permission to practice Analytical Psychology or Psychotherapy.

6. Entry into a Training Program

In case of later entry into regular training curricula, parts of the work done for the “Confirmation” may be accredited by the Director of Studies.

7. Tabular Overview

Oral examination in „Fundamentals of Analytical Psychology“ Duration 40 minutes
Jungian analysis with an accredited analyst recommended
